Pavement resurfacing on I-335/KTA to begin May 21

Emporia, Kan. – A pavement resurfacing project on I-335/KTA between mile markers 133.2 and 167.8 is set to begin Monday, May 21, 2018 and will be completed in late October, weather permitting.

The project includes milling and inlaying the driving lanes and sealing the shoulders of I-335/KTA. The Admire Interchange located at mile marker 147 will also be resurfaced.

Drivers can expect single lane closures between mile markers 133 and 168 on I-335/KTA with a 12-foot width restriction and speed reduced to 65 mph. They are encouraged to follow directions on posted signs and to use caution within the work zone.
