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KTA awards bridge preservation project in June

WICHITA, Kan.— The Kansas Turnpike Authority announces a bid has been approved and a contract awarded on an upcoming Turnpike construction project.

Contract #7336 – Painting eight bridges, to protect and preserve their structural steel, located between mile markers 20 and 60 on I-35/KTA in Sedgwick and Sumner Counties was awarded to Linder Painting, Inc., Lincoln, NB for \$307,903.00.
