I-35/KTA traffic impacts for East Kellogg construction

WICHITA, Kan. – Seven girders for a new bridge crossing over I-35/KTA at mile marker 52.4, in east Wichita, will cause impacts to Turnpike travel on Thursday, February 1 and Monday, February 5, weather permitting. The bridge is part of the new South Frontage Road being constructed in the Greenwich portion of the East Kellogg Improvement plan.

Travelers can expect north and southbound rolling roadblocks between mile marker 42 (near the South Wichita toll plaza) and mile marker 61 (south of the Towanda Service Area) from approximately 8 am to 4 pm to accommodate construction.

Rolling roadblocks will be used to slow traffic to approximately 25 mph to allow for construction without actually closing the road. Learn how rolling roadblocks work [here](#). Drivers should allow extra travel time on these days or seek alternate routes.
